

Appendix A

Writing New Lines

New London Librarium invites the Cheney family to contribute genealogical lines descending from Cheney family members noted in this book. Some five generations have come to life following the latest entries in the original 1897 edition. Our intention is to add appendices that lay out lines that descend from Generation 10 at the end of the original edition.

Since the original genealogy seems rather complete, subsequent lines probably descend from the individuals in Generation 10, but this does not preclude the possibility of someone finding a missing link back to an earlier generation. In any event, the offer to include people born after 1897 is limited to lines that connect back to a specific individual in this book.

To contribute a line, we would ask the following:

1. The line, or genealogy, must be complete from the last ancestor in the original book to the last descendant entered. It must include all appropriate individuals, including, at the very least, complete names, dates and places of birth, names of spouses (with, ideally, their dates and places), and all children, with dates.

2. The line must follow the numerical pattern that is used in this book (see below).

3. We can include a brief paragraph about individuals, giving the most important details of their lives, such as education, profession, places of residence, major accomplishments, military service, elected office. Narrative can include a *brief* sentence of subjective information— e.g. “he was known as an honest, hard-working man who loved children.” Brevity is essential here. We have no space for self-promotion. We want to avoid naming companies and brands. New London Librarium reserves the right to edit these narratives by deleting and rephrasing information (with approval of the contributor).

4. We do not require documentation, only affirmation that the information is correct. Again, the information must be complete, with rare exceptions. Note that New London Librarium cannot confirm or continue anyone’s research.

5. Each line will bear the name, town, and state of the individual who provided the information and the date the information is contributed.

6. Common-law marriages and long-term committed relationships can be noted as such with wording along the lines of “lived with partner so-and-so after (date),” with children listed as in any marriage. But the key words here are “long-term committed.” We want to avoid boyfriend/girlfriend situations unless they have produced progeny.

7. Same-sex marriages are acceptable when an official marriage has taken place. In cases of de facto marriages, i.e. long-term committed relationships, the entry may include wording to the effect of “lived with partner so-and-so after (date).” This wording and situation would be in line with item 6 above.

8. Ideally, adopted children should be noted as such, but in the interest of privacy and the protection of children, this note is not necessary.

The Numerical Pattern

Please study several entries through at least a couple of generations to understand the pattern for each individual. As an example, look at the entry for Thomas Cheney on page 34.

2. THOMAS,² (William¹) m. in Roxbury Jan. 11, 1655, Jane Atkinson, of whose birth and parentage no record has been found; she lived to a good old age, and died not far from the 29th of July, 1724.

Here's the Pattern:

Descendants of [either] William or John of Roxbury
Number of Generation

(John or William was the First Generation. The last entries in this book are the Tenth Generation. Each generation has an entry for each child of a given parent of the previous generation.)

2. — Don't worry about this number in bold print. It will be assigned. The purpose of this number is to help readers find entries of individuals.

THOMAS,² — This is the name of the person described in this generation. The roman numeral superscript (2) is his generation. Note that the name is all capital letters, followed by a comma, followed by a superscript number.

(William¹) — This is Thomas's father. Initial capital letter, then superscript of his generation. This will always be one number lower than the one on the name that's all capital letters. This name is in parenthesis. As we proceed through subsequent generations, this will become a list of names going back to the original

John or William, with descending superscripts.

m. — This means married. Then the place of marriage, the date of marriage, the spouse, then information about her, possibly including DOB, Place of Birth, her parents' names, even their DOB and POB. And her date and place of death.

Other abbreviations are b. for Birth, d. for Died. dau. for Daughter, div. for Divorced

In *The Cheney Genealogy—Part II*, we find the following entry starting on page 432.

Here's the pattern again:

The name of the first ancestor, John or William, with superscript¹ (centered)
The Number of the Generation (centered)

267. — Don't worry about this number. It will be assigned.

WILLIAM,⁸ — This is the person described in this entry. Call caps, followed by comma, superscript with number of generation. This number will be the same as in the generation section, in this case, "Eighth Generation."

(William,⁷ Thomas,⁶ Thomas,⁵ William⁴ William³, Thomas,² William,¹) — William⁷ is William⁸'s father. Thomas⁶ is William's father. Etc. Superscript for each generation back to John, the first ancestor of 1635. All in parentheses.

Now notice how the children are presented:

William is the only one with a three-digit number beside his name because he is the only one with a subsequent entry for his details. The girls, being female, have no subsequent entries.

Notice:

- The daughters will not be followed elsewhere in the original book because, once married, she was no longer a Cheney). For that reason, her children are noted after her name, not separately below, as with the sons. (See below for rules for new entries of daughters.) Since there is no subsequent entry for Eliza Ann, there is no bold 3-digit number to the left of her name.

- The 3-digit numbers (e.g. 267 and 470) will be assigned. This number is used to direct the reader to the subsequent generation where there is more information about the individual.

- Each child's name is upper case letters with a superscript for his or her generation, which, of course will be one number higher than the father's (i.e. Cyrus's).

- The only information with each child is DOB and, if any, DOD. Anything besides DOB will be given in that person's full description in the next generation. These subsequent entries will be easy to find thanks to the 3-digit number that precedes the name. New London Librarium will assign those numbers.

Daughters

In case you haven't noticed, times have changed since 1897! Today it seems odd, if not cruel, to ignore the descendants of female ancestors. In the original genealogy, daughters are mentioned under "Children," along with DOB, DOD, places, and a list of their spouse and children. There are no subsequent entries for her children. One reason for that is the immense complexity of following family members who have different last names. It gets even more complicated if wives and their ancestors are given separate, numbered entries.

New London Librarium would like to show a little more respect for the women in the family. We will allow daughters to be treated the same way as sons, with full entries for them, including the names and statistics for their spouses and children, and a brief narrative about her and them. However, we will have to avoid the complications of following the descendants of those children.

Appendices

Appendix B in this volume is from Part II, the descendants of John Cheney. It is included in this volume as an illustration of a lineage extended from the 10th generation in that book. Appendix C presents lineage descending to the family of former vice presiden Richard Bruce Cheney.

Submitting Lineage

The above explanations will be clear only if the reader makes an attempt to study several entries in the original book. Study them until you understand. Also see Appendix B as a model. Then type up a lineage, beginning at the last entry in the original book, i.e. Generation 10. Be very careful with spellings and accuracy.

The information should be typed in a common word processing application so it can be sent by email to New London Librarium. (If absolutely necessary, the information can be provided on paper by regular mail.) This email should include the name, address, phone number, and email address of the person sending it.

Ralph Albert held several jobs of various types, seeing his family through the difficult years of the Great Depression and World War II. He is known to have been a chauffeur, a parent (with Ruth) at an orphanage for boys, and a payroll administrator at a small company. He was known to be an honest man of consistent effort. Last residence was in Ridgefield, Conn.

Ruth Rees was a kind and gentle woman who worked at various jobs through the Great Depression and World War II. In later years she was a visiting nurse. Last residence, following Ralph Albert’s passing, was Fairfield, Conn.

Theodore Albert Rees Cheney served in the U.S. Navy shortly after graduating from high school, touring the Arctic and Antarctic regions, the latter as yeoman to Admiral Richard E. Byrd. Shortly after honorable discharge he married Dorothy Bates. He earned a B.S. in Geology at Boston University, then pursued a post-graduate degree at Cornell, where he taught briefly. He and family would reside in Ithaca, N.Y., Columbus, Ohio, Louisville, Ky., Mt. Kisco, N.Y., South Salem, N.Y., and Fairfield, Conn. Early in his career he founded a company, Geotechnics & Resources, which had several years of success in cartography, aerial photo analysis, and related services. In about 1970 he became Associate Dean of the Fairfield University Graduate School of Communication, where he later taught and earned a Master's degree. He authored several books, including *Getting the Words Right: How to Rewrite, Edit, and Revise* and *Writing Creative Nonfiction*. *Nature's Art* is a collection of fine black and white photographs in a genre he dubbed "geophotography." He was known as an honest, hard-working man who valued nature, creativity, education, humor, and people. He followed the Scout Law his entire life and was a Scout leader as an adult. He d. at Bridgeport Hospital Mar. 28, 2008.

Dorothy Catherine Bates was born on July 28, 1924 in Louisville, Ky., dau. of Calvin Roy Bates, b. July 13, 1898, probably in Paduca, Ky., and Beulah Zulena (Williams) Bates, b. August 26, 1898 in Louisville. Dorothy served in the U.S. Navy during World War II, when she helped draw maps of Tokyo Harbor. She graduated from U. of Louisville in 1949 with a B.A. in Fine Arts. She dedicated her married life to the attentive care of four children and a mother crippled with chronic arthritis. For many years she was a docent in the Fairfield Historical Society.

After earning a degree in working with children with disabilities, Solange Aurora founded a school for such children in Itajubá, M.G., Brazil. After working at various administrative jobs in Brazil and the U.S. she founded a small but consistently successful export company in 1989 and gained a reputation for honest, diligent work with Brazilian clients and suppliers in various countries. She also founded, managed and designed a widely admired store, O! Brasil, in New London, Conn. She is known as a just and generous employer.
